

## Performance of Martian invasion causes panic!

On October 30<sup>th</sup> 1938, thousands of people in the United States believed that Martians - extraterrestrials from the planet Mars - were invading the Earth. Why?

This is a part of the script from the radio broadcast:

REPORTER: Ladies and gentlemen, this is the most terrifying thing I have ever witnessed.

(SHOUTS FROM THE CROWD)

REPORTER: Something's wriggling out of the shadow like a grey snake. Now another one, and another. They look like tentacles to me. ... I can see the thing's body. It's as large as a bear and it's gleaming like wet leather. ... Ladies and gentlemen, it's indescribable. I can hardly force myself to keep looking at it. The eyes are black and gleam like a serpent. The mouth is V-shaped with saliva dripping from its lips. ... The monster or whatever it is can hardly move. It seems weighed down by . . . possibly gravity or something. The thing's standing up. The crowd is running away. ... This is the most extraordinary experience.

People who hadn't heard the beginning of the radio play thought the news report was real. Many of them panicked. Some of them got in their cars and drove out of New Jersey. Some of them hid in basements. Some of them wore gas masks and prepared to defend themselves with guns.

The mass hysteria caused by the infamous broadcast of *The War of the Worlds* in 1938 proved how powerful the influence of radio could be.
